THE HISTORY OF CENTURY CLUB

The Century Club became the University of Southern California's first support group in 1955. Since then it has raised more than four million dollars for the USC School of Dentistry.

The objective of the Century Club is to actively support and promote the advancement of dental education at the USC School of Dentistry. Contributions from Century Club members present a source of funds to meet special needs as they arise, providing assistance with the many projects which enrich dental education.

Century Club donations helped construct the Norris Dental Science Center, complete the diagnostic sciences section, install an audiovisual teaching system in the multidisciplinary lab, and renovate the Rex Ingraham Operative Dentistry Clinic. More recently the Century Club donated \$168,000 toward completion of the state-of-the-art central sterilization facility and established an endowment fund for attending to sudden and unforeseen situations.
