Dr. Marchack graduated from USC School of Dentistry and received his MBA from UCLA. Dr Marchack is the immediate past president of the American Academy of Esthetic Dentistry, the vice-chair of the Editorial Council for the Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry, president-elect of the Pacific Coast Society for Prosthodontics, vice-president of the American Prosthodontic Society and serves on the Board of Councilors of the USC School of Dentistry. He is the author of numerous articles and has presented over 200 lectures nationally and internationally. Dr. Marchack maintains a private practice with a main emphasis on restorative and implant dentistry in Pasadena, California.

SYNOPSIS

Patients today are increasingly aware of dental implants, and their expectations are for esthetically and functionally pleasing implant restorations that mimic natural teeth.

This course for restorative dentists will give both the experienced and novice practitioner a better understanding of how restorative implant dentistry has evolved.

In addition to the lecture and demonstrations, participants will have the opportunity to participate in a hands-on workshop simulating impression-making techniques for both internal-connection and external-connection implants, as well as for various abutments.

Topics to be covered:

- Treatment planning for implant restorations
- Individual vs. splinted implant restorations
- Cemented vs. screw retained restorations
- Abutment level vs. implant level restorations
- Internal vs. external connections
- Occlusal schemes for implant restorations

- Prescribe desired implants and refer to the implant surgeon
