SYNOPSIS

New diseases, as well as the return of some once thought eradicated diseases, are a major concern in the modern dental practice. It seems as if every few months a new disease is developing. The signs and symptoms of many emerging diseases such as SARS, variant Creutzfeldt-Jakob (Mad Cow Disease), Avian flu and the West Nile Virus will be described and effective preventive measures will be discussed. The course will also cover topics such as general disease transmission, universal and standard precautions, disinfection and sterilization as well as proper waste management.

The course will also review Cal-DOSH's (formerly known as CalOSHA) top 20 dental office violations, discuss the updated CDC guidelines and review the mandated minimum standards for infection control in the dental setting from the Dental Board of California Regulations. Participants will also be provided with an easy-to-apply checklist for reviewing their office's compliance with infection control and safety policies and guidelines.

Another concern for dentists in California and their staff is the wide array of regulations, recommendations, and guidelines intended to make the practice of dentistry

safer for dental personnel and patients. This part of the course will focus on issues of legal importance to the dentist and his/her team. It will include analysis of the basic rules for avoiding legal disputes with patients and the principles involved in enjoying a practice free from entanglements with licensing agencies in California, particularly the Dental Board.

Upon completion of this course you will:

- Learn principles of disease transmission and Universal/Standard Precautions
- Understand Cal-DOSH compliance issues, sterilization and disinfection
- Become familiar with the updated CDC infection control guidelines
- Understand the infection control practices mandated by the Dental Board of California
- Learn how to use your dental auxiliaries effectively within California law
- Know the recent changes in the law and the rules for avoiding legal problems in your dental practice
- Be able to provide a safer environment for your patients and your dental team
