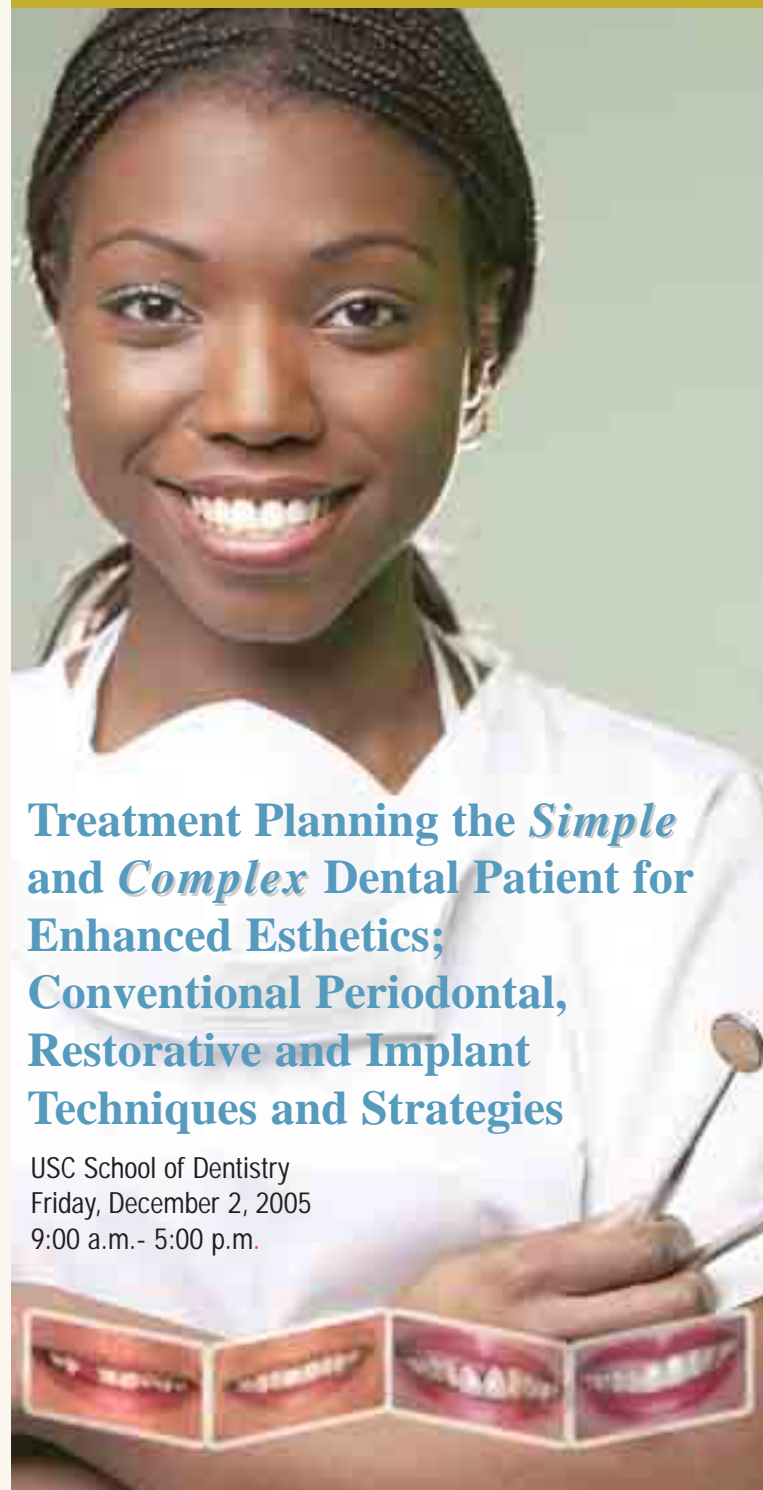

SPEAKERS



George C. Cho, DDS, FACP

Associate Professor in the Division of Primary Oral Health Care, Clinical Director of the Advanced Education in Prosthodontics and Director of Predoctoral Implant Dentistry at the University of Southern California School of Dentistry. Dr. Cho received his dental degree from the University of Southern California, School of

Dentistry in 1987. He practiced dentistry and taught at USC School of Dentistry for one year prior to entering the Advanced Education in Prosthodontics Program at the University of Southern California. He graduated from the program in 1990 and has been since a full time faculty member.

Dr. Cho has developed and taught courses at the pre and postdoctoral levels primarily involved with dental esthetics, implants and fixed prosthodontics. He has published articles and lectured on topics of restorative dentistry and dental materials. Dr. Cho is also a fellow of the American Board of Prosthodontics, member of the American Academy of Restorative Dentistry, ADA, CDA, and Western Los Angeles Dental Society. He maintains a private practice limited to Prosthodontics in Torrance, California.

SYNOPSIS

Interdisciplinary treatment planning strategies will be discussed for the management of the simple to complex dental patients. Factors of esthetics, soft tissue management, fixed prosthodontics as well as dental implants will be presented in a step by step fashion. Presentation will involve use of diagnostic wax-up and "clip-on" overlay provisional restorations. Simple and quick provisional techniques for conventional temporary restorations as well as esthetic custom provisional restorations will be presented. This will be a precursor to a hands on laboratory course for provisional restorations in February 2006.

Treatment restorations involving porcelain veneer restorations, all ceramic crown restorations as well as

conventional fixed partial denture restorations will be presented. Principles and techniques of adhesive dentistry will be presented for the management of cuspal fractures without Endodontic therapy. Group interaction with audience and examples and recommendations for "biologic width" involvement, esthetic crown lengthening, implants and orthodontics and dental reconstruction will be presented.

At conclusion, participants will be able to know:

- Treatment planning factors:
 - Treatment letter: Chief complaint, diagnosis, prognosis, treatment options, fees and warranty
 - Fixed partial dentures, porcelain inlay/onlay restorations, porcelain veneers, and Implants
 - Case presentation with audience participation
- Diagnostic factors of esthetics:
 - Tooth/teeth factors
 - Gingival architecture
 - Smile line concept
- Soft tissue management and techniques with provisional restorations:
 - Custom characterization of the provisional restoration
 - Manipulation for gingival esthetics
 - Clip-on prosthesis
- Adhesive dentistry update regarding dentin bonding procedures:
 - Technique for indirect ceramic restorations
- Implant dentistry:
 - Advantages and disadvantages
 - Screw retention vs. cemented restorations
 - Technique for soft tissue emergence profile
